The Mapping Medieval Chester Project has been developed by Swansea University, Queen's University Belfast and King's College London and funded by the Arts and Humanities Research Council. It explores how the landscape and urban layout produced a sense of identity for medieval inhabitants of the City, using literature, geography, archaeology and history. The project has produced a web-site featuring a multi-layered map of Chester at the end of the Middle Ages, linked to medieval texts which also map the city. To celebrate its launch there will be a series of events around Chester.
